MARSHALL COUNTY POOR FARM AND GRAND VUE PARK

Grand Vue Park is a county park operated by the Marshall County Park and Recreation Board. The park was opened in 1974 and has gone through several stages of development. It was built on 125 acres that was formerly the Marshall County Poor Farm. Land from the former Darwish and Sibert farms was added as well as land from the Dobbs family. Today the park encompasses 650 acres and offers lodging, zip lining, an aerial adventure park, paintball, geocaching, outdoor amphitheater, banquet hall, picnic shelters, aquatic center, golf, playground, walking and biking trails as well as a calendar of events and day camps.



Before the U.S. welfare safety nets were put into place, local counties and townships across the country had to provide their own safety nets.

"Poorhouse," as a term, is not well-known in the 21st century but it wasn't that long ago that you might hear someone say "You're going to run me to the poorhouse" when their fortunes were taking a turn for the worse or their finances were dwindling.

In an article written by Tracey Tyler, the poorhouse is explained in this way: These "houses of industry and refuge," as they came to be known, were shelters of last resort for the destitute, homeless, "feeble-minded" and elderly. In exchange for their labour, they were provided with spartan accommodation, clothes and simple food, much of it grown themselves.





The need for such places basically disappeared once Social Security was in place. By the 1950s, "poorhouses" had become a thing of the past.

50 YEARS OF GRAND VUE PARK

Grand Vue Park, which opened its doors to Marshall County in 1974, is now celebrating its 50th anniversary. As with other long-standing institutions, Grand Vue Park has a rich history, including the Steppenwolf concert, the slide at the pool, the numerous holes in one on the Par 3 golf course, and Life Camp, among other stories. Since 2008, the park has made significant strides in regaining its status as one of the top county parks in the Ohio Valley and the state of West Virginia.







Under the leadership of Don Mason and the Marshall County Commission, Grand Vue Park became a priority as a place where residents could play, and families could gather. The park added several new amenities in 2006, including the Banquet Hall/Park office building, a miniature golf course, and three Deluxe cabins. In 2010, phase 1 of a new pool was opened as part of a three-phase project. The oil and gas boom in Marshall County enabled the park to use its lease payments to fund its expansion, which began with the construction of the zipline canopy tour and low ropes course in 2012.



In 2015, we expanded the basecamp area by adding an adventure park. Concurrently, we constructed four luxurious treetop villas, which were unveiled in October 2016. In the following four years, we dedicated ourselves to enhancing the quality of our amenities by refurbishing the traditional cabins to make them more welcoming.



We also added full baths and two queen beds to the basements of the deluxe cabins and the Eagle house underwent a complete renovation for a fresh look.

In 2020, we began building a 40-site RV park on the former par-3 golf course, which was a difficult decision for the board due to its historical significance. The RV Park opened in April 2021. Subsequently, we decided to expand the pool area. With the support of the Marshall County Commission, we were able to build a state-of-the-art water park that debuted in July 2023.

Over the years, we have added several other amenities, such as 3 disc golf courses, Flurry's Ice Cream and Sweets shop, a general store, the Vue Bar and Grill, a full-service restaurant, new shelters, updated restroom facilities, walking trails, geocaches, mountain bike trails, summer camp programs, and infrastructure such as fiber for internet connectivity and of course the scenic overlook which offers a breathtaking view of the City of Moundsville.





The realization of Grand Vue Park has been made possible by the collaborative efforts of various partners who share a profound love for the Ohio Valley and, more specifically, Marshall County. The park's remarkable amenities are the product of local contractors' hard work, who take great pride in contributing to the park's growth.


